### Eligibility

Teachers who are aspiring to middle leadership and meet the following criteria:

- Likely to be in a middle leadership role in the next 12-18 months
- Have completed at least one year of full time teaching

or are currently in middle leadership roles such as:

- In secondary settings will have roles such as Head of year, Head of department, whole school lead role
- In primary schools will have roles such as phase leaders, key stage leaders or whole school lead

### NPQML Programme

The main focus of this programme is ensure that all participants increase their confidence, capability and impact as a middle leader.

The course will empower participants to proactively develop a strong network to support them in their first steps into leadership.

Participants will be assessed through a written assignment to ensure that they have reached the qualification requirements plus a viva interview to assess them against the more challenging Ambition bar.

The programme will comprise of 3 full day face to face sessions led by 2 experienced Ambition accredited facilitators who are current serving middle leaders. The course will finish within a school year.

It will cover six areas of focus:

- Strategy and Improvement
- Teaching and curriculum excellence
- Leading with impact
- Working in partnership
- Managing resources
- Risks and increasing capability
